## 20 Years and Still going Strong

P.A.W.S. was founded in November 1989 as an auxiliary of Assistance League of Tucson to provide volunteer opportunities to women in the workforce. This auxiliary focuses on helping children in crisis. Its mission is to "enrich the spirit of a child." Project Teddy Bear was the first program on which P.A.W.S. embarked. Funding comes from the annual Teddy Bear Tea and the Share-a-Bear campaign. The tea, now in its fifth year, is a Traditional English Tea. It is a fun, kid-friendly event with bears and raffle prizes.

Additional programs for children in crisis supported by these wonderful professional women include Food for Thought and Hooked on Books. Food for Thought

provides healthy snacks for children being helped by the Southern Arizona Child Advocacy Center. Hooked on Books is a program to encourage literacy. Age appropriate books are donated to the Tucson Unified School District Refugee Task Force. Children new to our country and schools learn English with the aid of these donated books.

To accommodate the demands of volunteering and working, P.A.W.S. alternates the time of their monthly meetings between 7:30 am one month and 6:00 pm the next month. ## Rescued by a Bear

Every week P.A.W.S. receives cards from the agencies who give out P.A.W.S. Bears, telling the stories of the children who receive the bears. From the Southern Arizona Child Advocacy Center, a four year old boy who was being interviewed for abuse was given a bear. His two year old sister, who became quite upset when she saw

her brother clutching his bear, was thrilled to get her own bear. A grief counselling center gave a bear to a 9 year old child whose mother had been murdered. From University Medical Center, a child entered chemotherapy hugging a P.A.W.S. bear. The P.A.W.S. Bears gave them all comfort during very difficult times.

Putting smiles on the faces of the 3,875 children we dressed this year is why the traditions of giving back to the community are so important.

This year we were able to provide new clothing

and school supplies to more children than in any other year. Each dressing brings 32 children to the Philanthropic Programs Center on Alvernon where they are greeted by volunteers who work one-on-one with each child. Our reward is the smiles we receive.



**Starting Over Supplies.** Families or individuals who have overcome obstacles such as domestic violence, homelessness, drug and alcohol addiction may not have basic household items like bedding, toiletries or kitchen supplies as they are "starting over." Assistance League of Tucson volunteers are there to help. Last year our caring volunteers assembled kits for 1,342 clients of thirteen social service agencies. 600 kits were packed totaling \$54,700.

**Assault Survivor Kits®** Can you imagine the fear and anxiety of victims of rape or assault as they are examined in the Emergency Room? Partnering with the Southern Arizona Center Against Sexual Assault (SACASA), we have responded to the needs of these women, men and children in our community, providing supplies for 200 survivors last year. Their clothing is often retained by the police as forensic evidence. Our volunteers... and your donations... provide new sweat pants, socks, t-shirts, sweatshirts, underwear, flip-flops and tennis shoes plus toiletry items. This allows the victim to leave the hospital or trauma center with dignity. The average cost per person is \$10; we spend about \$2,000 each year.

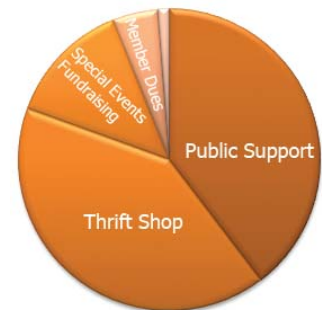

### Power of the Teddy Bear

P.A.W.S. has distributed over 20,000 teddy bears to children in time of crisis and need through approximately 30 law enforcement, social service agencies and hospitals in Southern Arizona. The cost of the bears and distribution are paid for by membership dues, annual Teddy Bear Tea event and the Share a Bear program. Members participate in the bagging and delivery of the bears.

These small, stuffed, cuddly creatures possess the super hero power to soothe the cries of a terrified child being removed from an abusive home environment, console a devastated youngster when a mother or father dies, comfort a baby lying critically ill in a hospital nursery and even help reignite a lost memory of security in a teenager abandoned and alone.

The stoic, professional service workers, who interact daily with the most vulnerable members of our society, extol the Power of the Teddy Bear. Thousands of response cards from the agencies document how, when, why and to whom the bears are distributed. These notes tell the stories of pain, loss, desperation and fear. These notes also capture the moments of relief when a child encounters the soft, snuggly, squeezable safety of a Teddy Bear.

The Teddy Bears appear out of the trunks of police patrol cars, from bags under emergency room desks and out of the desk drawers of forensic interviewers. Each Teddy Bear enters the life of a child at a moment of crisis delivering a much needed dose of love.
